



SAFETY AND SECURITY

For the month of April crime has spiked tremendously. Concerns were raised regarding an increase in Business Robberies in the area.

There seems to be a network of criminals operating from Happy Valley. we have identified a house where scrap is being taken and stored at. The City's Metal Theft Unit have attended to this complaint and will monitor the address.

Crime hotspots are between the Traffic light on the intersection of Range and Stellenbosch Arterial and Wimbledon Road at the four way stop street, Electron Road, Artisan Road, Dynamo Street, Range Road and Heath Circle

Action Steps

1. Brendan van der Merwe requested greater visibility from SAPS and ST3 Security especially in the hot spot areas named above.
2. The illegal and often dangerous trailer stacking problem along Range Road to be addressed by Law Enforcement and the Traffic Department.
3. Metal theft unit to address an illegal "chop shop" located in Happy Valley.

Most incidents of crime are related to personal crimes like muggings, where phones, cash and personal items are targeted, however there have been several business robberies as well.

Blackheath CCTV and LPR camera network

All LPR networks are up and running smoothly and the camera network is growing. There are now 19 active CCTV cameras operating in and around the Blackheath Industrial Area.

The SAPS Sector 3 – Security Forum Meeting took place on the 10th May 2016 and below are the STATS for the month of April 2016.

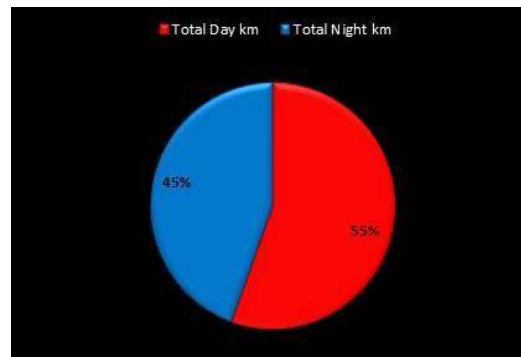
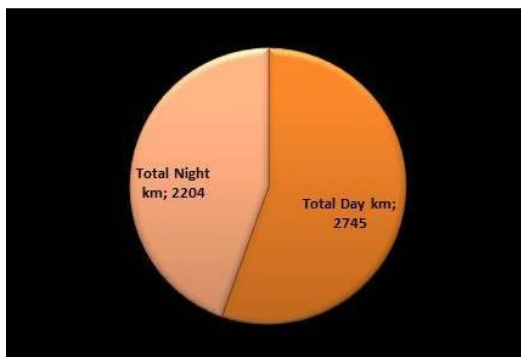
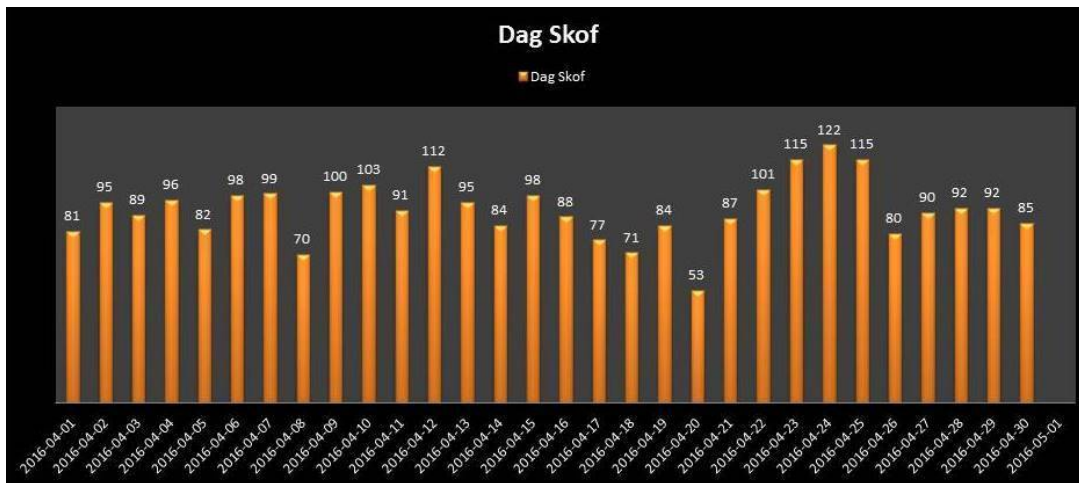
