### **Dam levels continue to rise, usage remains stable**

Dam levels continue to improve and have risen encouragingly by 4% over the last week to 74% of storage capacity.

The average water consumption for the past week is up slightly from 505 million litres per day to 511 million litres per day.

The City of Cape Town urges its water users to continue to heed the call to conserve water over the next few months as the City monitors the water situation going into summer.

Water restrictions and tariffs will be lowered from Level 6 to Level 5 from 1

October 2018 due to the encouraging dam recovery and the ongoing conservation efforts by Capetonians. These reductions are premised on the expectation that water users will continue to use water sparingly so that overall usage remains in the current 500 million litre per day bracket.
